GLOBAL GRATITUDE ALLIANCE RECEIVES EBAY FOUNDATION GRANT FOR VOCATIONAL TRAINING FOR HIV AFFECTED YOUTH IN ETHIOPIA

SAN FRANCISCO, California, August 20, 2014 – Global Gratitude Alliance (formerly, The Gracias Foundation) an organization committed to empowering vulnerable women and children, announced today that it has been awarded a grant from the eBay Foundation Corporate Advised Fund at Silicon Valley Community Foundation. The grant was recommend by eBay Foundation's employee volunteer led San Jose Bay Area GIVE Team. Funds will be used for vocational training classes for adolescent youth in Ethiopia, orphaned and affected by HIV/AIDS, giving them a chance to build self-esteem, gain the tools needed to make positive life choices, and eventually pave the road to self-dependence.

"This program is such an important step for the youth we are serving in Ethiopia," said Amy Paulson, President and Co-Founder of Global Gratitude Alliance. "They are the first adolescents, cared for by our local partner, who are transitioning to adulthood rather than dying from AIDS. Whereas other programs often force an entire group of survivors into learning the same skill, this program encourages each youth to discover and cultivate his or her unique interests, treating each person as an individual worthy of pursuing his or her own dreams."

The vocational training project was made possible in part through eBay Foundation's GIVE Team program, which empowers employees of eBay Inc. to support their communities through volunteerism and employee-sponsored grants. In 2013 alone, GIVE Teams worldwide recommended over 200 nonprofits to receive grants totaling more than \$1,100,000.
